

Jesus in the Passover

PASSOVER	JESUS, LAMB OF GOD
Unblemished male lamb, a year old (Ex 12:5)	God's perfect, firstborn son (Luke 23:4)
Chosen lamb enters family's home on the 10th day of Nisan (first Hebrew month). (Ex 12:3)	Jesus entered Jerusalem on the 10th day of Nisan. (John 12)
For 4 days the lamb stays with the family. (Ex 12:6)	For four days Jesus stayed in Jerusalem. (John 12)
The lamb was tied to the alter at 9 a.m.	Jesus was nailed to the cross at 9 a.m. (Mark 15:25)
The lamb was slain at 3 p.m.	Jesus died at 3 p.m at the age of 33. (Mark 15:33)
The lamb's bones were not broken. (Ex 12:46)	Jesus' bones were not broken, even though that was the custom. (John 1:29, 19:31-34)
A hyssop plant was used to apply the lamb's blood to the door posts. (Exodus 12:22)	Roman soldiers used a hyssop branch to give Jesus sour wine when he was on the cross. (John 19:28-30)
God passed over the homes with the sacrificial lamb's blood over the door.	God's judgment passes over those who accept the perfect lamb, His son.
